The Integrated HIV/HTN Project is a ground-breaking initiative that seeks to address the dual threat of HIV and hypertension in Uganda. Since the project's launch, Ms. Kabami has been at the forefront of its implementation. Her leadership, expertise, and passion for improving health outcomes in Uganda have been instrumental in driving the project forward.

The recent presentation by Ms. Kabami marked a crucial moment in the project's progress. Her report outlined the results of the baseline assessment conducted at the beginning of the project and highlighted some of the initiatives implemented in the past year. "One of the things we have done is providing training to the health workers so that they are able to provide health education to the patients. Overall, we have seen that patients' dual diagnosis (HIV and hypertensive) in care increased dramatically from 24 to 30 to 50 in one year. Among these patients, hypertension control has improved but we still have a lot of work to do." Jane Kabami, Principal Investigator, Integrated HIV/HTN.

Her dedication to the project and to bettering the lives of individuals living with HIV and hypertension is truly inspiring. This project is implemented by a consortium led by the Infectious Diseases Research Collaboration (IDRC) in collaboration with, the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM), the Uganda Heart Institute (UHI), the Ministry of Health Uganda (MoH) and Makerere University.
